

The creation of the Berlin Christmas Market Finder meant there were suddenly a whole lot more reasons to go out and enjoy a mug of mulled wine together: this interactive map shows more than 60 Christmas markets in Berlin which can be filtered by location, offerings, admission prices and opening hours. 
