


Berlin's Bürgerämter: more appointments, less waiting time?



How can appointments be organized more efficiently at Berlin's Bürgerämter? We've been looking into this question in recent months in a collaborative project with the Bürgeramt in Friedrichshain-Kreuzberg and the Senate Department for the Interior. By applying a service design process created by us, we were able to identify one particular time-waster at citizen centers: if people fail to show up for a booked appointment, the appointment simply passes by unused and can't be spontaneously rescheduled. A more flexible check-in system ought to be able to solve this problem – at least that's the assumption.

At the end of last year, our team of developers came up with a prototype for a system of this kind that we were able to test at the citizen center vocational training department in Kreuzberg – with very pleasing results. Together with the team headed by Berlin's CDO Ralf Kleindiek, we then ran a second test during day-to-day operations at the Friedrichshain-Kreuzberg citizen center in Yorckstrasse.

Our project managers have compiled the promising results in this blog post. We can't wait to see how the check-in system will develop from here!

Blog: The LABissage in pictures








Event Highlights
