

UX Writing for Berlin's Administration: Users First – Bureaucratic German Second

Whether it's an online application or booking an appointment: in digital administrative services, small texts often make the biggest difference. UX writing helps users navigate securely and intuitively – without unnecessary obstacles. And clear language isn't just a nice-to-have: only about 5% of the German population have language skills at the C1 level – the level at which many official texts are written. If you want to reach everyone, you need to communicate more simply.
